Camp Kala is a summer youth arts program. Interns will work with students of different ages, grades and skill levels. Each week focuses on a specified age group (5-10 or 11-17) and emphasizes different art practices and techniques. The position offers a wide variety of tasks on any given day, from working directly with youth on a variety of art

projects, assisting Teaching Artists on a variety of projects, installing weekly, semiformal exhibitions of student work, organizing and preparing supplies and materials, and photographing student art work.

The skills acquired in this internship may be applicable to other museum, gallery, and education professions.

• Support curriculum development and implementation as directed by Teaching Artists and Program Coordinator
